CREDENTIALING INFORMATION FOR LOCUM TENENS LICENSE TO PRACTICE PODIATRIC

MEDICINE AND SURGERY

An applicant who holds a valid license to practice podiatric medicine and surgery issued by another licensing jurisdiction of the United States may apply to the board for a locum tenens license to practice podiatric medicine and surgery shall submit to the board all of the following (Wis. Admin. Code § [POD 1.09](#)):

1. Application and applicable fee(s) submitted online via LicensE.
2. A letter from a podiatrist licensed to practice podiatric medicine and surgery in this state requesting the applicant's services.
3. A verified photostatic copy of a license to practice podiatric medicine and surgery issued by another licensing jurisdiction of the United States to the applicant.
4. Evidence of successful completion of an open book examination on statutes and rules governing the practice of podiatric medicine and surgery in Wisconsin.

Please note the following:

- The holder of a locum tenens license to practice podiatric medicine and surgery shall practice podiatric medicine and surgery as defined in Wis. Stat. § [448.60\(4\)](#), providing the practice is confined to the geographical area for which the license is issued.
- A locum tenens license to practice podiatric medicine and surgery shall expire 90 days from the date of its issuance. For cause shown to its satisfaction, the board, acting through its designated member, may renew the locum tenens license for additional periods of 90 days each, but no license may be renewed more than 3 consecutive times.

Application for licensure will be reviewed by members of the Podiatry Affiliated Credentialing Board prior to issuance of a license.

Documents received for this locum tenens license are not transferable to a permanent podiatric medicine and surgery license application file.
